(1) If a student has more than two final examinations scheduled on the same day, the student may petition the Office of the Registrar to reschedule one of the exams.

(2) Classes beginning after 5:00 p.m. will have final exams at their scheduled class times during Exam Week.

(3) The final exam schedule also provides options for multiple section examinations; course faculty may schedule several sections during a common time by contacting the registrar. Multiple sections exams may be scheduled during the evening (4:00 - 6:00 pm, and 6:10 - 8:10 pm), Monday through Friday, and all exam slots on Saturday.

### WRITING COMPETENCY EXAM

The WCE is a graduation requirement of Saint Francis University. Students in the junior cohort who have completed at least 60 credits, but no more than 95, who have not yet passed this exam **will be automatically enrolled\* in the exam** after grades from the Spring 2019 Writing Competency Exam have been submitted. (\*Students who have earned a C or better in WRIT 199, *Argumentative Writing*, are exempt from taking the WCE. Students enrolled in WRIT 199 for the Fall 2019 Semester will not be enrolled in WCE.) Students will not be allowed to drop the exam except under extraordinary conditions, and with the approval of their advisor and of the Director of General Education. Early in the semester students will have the opportunity to sign up for one of several dates during which the exam will be offered. Students who are enrolled in the exam during the Fall but fail to take it, will receive an “F” on their transcripts.

## REGISTRATION POLICIES

1. **WEB REGISTRATION BY STUDENTS.** Students will register for their Fall 2019 courses by themselves on the My.Francis portal.
2. **ASSIGNED REGISTRATION TIMES.** Not all students will be able to register for courses when the portal is opened for registration on Tuesday, April 23  
Students will be able to access the registration site according to scheduled registration times that are based on earned **credits (not including credits currently registered for Spring 2019)**. Please consult the table of registration times listed elsewhere in the Instructions for the Schedule of Classes.
3. **CONFLICTS BETWEEN REGISTRATION TIMES AND CURRENT CLASS SCHEDULES.** Students should not miss a fall semester class in order to register at assigned registration times; rather, they should attend class and register afterward.
4. **CONTINUED ACCESS TO THE PORTAL.** Students will be able to access the registration portal at their assigned registration time, and at any time after their assigned registration time. For example, if you will be in class at the time you are assigned access to the portal, you will be able to access the portal at your convenience any time thereafter. The registration portal will remain open for student access through the end of the Change of Schedule period on Tuesday, September 3, 2019.
5. **ADVISORS' CLEARANCE FOR STUDENT REGISTRATION.** Students will not be able to register for any course without first meeting with advisors to obtain clearance for registration. The advisor will clear the student in the system, so that the web portal will allow registration.
6. **"HOLDS" ON REGISTRATION.** Students should access the registration portal well in advance of their assigned registration times in order to ensure that there are no "holds" on their registration (such as a financial hold resulting from a past-due student account balance).  
Students whose access to the registration site is blocked by a Financial Hold should contact the Business Office in 114 Raymond Hall to resolve the issue prior to the assigned registration time.
7. **COURSES REQUIRING INSTRUCTOR'S PERMISSION.** Students will not be able to register on-line for courses requiring the instructor's permission. To register for a course requiring the instructor's permission, a student should bring a signed permission slip, along with a drop/add slip signed by the student's academic advisor, to the registrar's office at any time after the student's scheduled registration time.  
Forms are available only online at My.Francis.
8. **VARIABLE CREDIT COURSES.** Students will not be able to register on-line for any variable-credit courses (such as internships or applied music instruction). In those cases, a student should bring a signed drop/add slip to the registrar's office at any time after the

student's assigned registration time, and the registrar's office staff will register the course manually. Forms are available only online at My.Francis.

9. **MAXIMUM CREDIT LOAD.** You may register on-line for a maximum of 18 credits. Permission to carry more than 18 credits must be obtained from the Office of Academic Affairs prior to registration. Necessary forms are available on-line at My.Francis. You must register any credits in excess of the 18 credit maximum by submitting a drop/add slip to the registrar's office.

Forms are available only online at My.Francis.

10. **PASS/FAIL** Students wishing to select the pass/fail option for any authorized course must do so at the Registrar's Office no later than Tuesday, September 3, 2019.

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### REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

1. Make an appointment to meet with your academic advisor prior to your assigned registration time. Consult the class listings prior to meeting with your advisor.
2. At your assigned registration time, log into My.Francis. You will not be able to register for any course without first having obtained clearance from your advisor.
3. Do not log onto My.Francis prior to your assigned registration time. If you do so, the system will prevent you from registering at your assigned time because you were not authorized to register when you first logged-on.
4. Click on the "Current Students" tab.
5. Under "Records and Academics," click on the first group of options (On-line Schedule, Registration . . .)
6. Click on the Green Plus (+) sign to Add/Drop courses.
7. For registration for Fall Semester 2019 courses, choose "FA 2019" from the drop-down menu.
8. Follow the instructions that will be provided to you on the screen. The process is self-explanatory, but you may get assistance by clicking on the "Help" tab on My.Francis.

10. Although some registration times begin at 5:50 a.m., please note that offices that provide assistance and advice on registration issues will observe normal weekday office hours

beginning at 8:30 a.m. If you are scheduled to have access to the registration site before 8:30 a.m. and are not able to complete your class scheduling, please contact the appropriate office after 8:30 a.m.

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**“REGISTRATION ROUND-UP”  
Help Desk in Padua Hall**

Students needing assistance with the class registration process are encouraged to attend Registration Round-Up in the Padua Hall Lounge 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Friday, April 26. Staff members from the Center for Academic Success and First-Year Advisors will be available to assist students.

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**REGISTRATION TIMES**

Determine your scheduled registration time according to the chart below by identifying your "earned credit" category. **Do not include the credits for the courses in which you are currently enrolled.** You will be able to access the registration portal **beginning** on the day and time that correspond to your earned hours on the chart below. Your registration period will remain open through Tuesday, September 3, 2019.

Please note that the registration times have been scheduled in such a way as to reduce conflicts between a student’s scheduled registration time and a scheduled class. That advantage will not necessarily apply to all registration times on Tuesdays and Thursdays, due to the scheduling of 75 minute classes on those days rather than 50 minute classes.

**CLASS FORMAT DESIGNATORS**

Class listings in the Schedule of Classes include an entry that indicates the format of each course. The format indicator will be listed immediately following the course number, section, and credit hours, under the heading “Fmt.” The notations **WE, HY, FO, and CE** are defined below:

**WE (Web-Enhanced):** A web-enhanced course is a face-to-face course which uses online technology to support access to course materials, activities, and communication tools. In a web-enhanced course, use of the website does not substitute for class attendance. Classes will meet face-to-face in a traditional classroom on a designated day and time.

**HY (Hybrid):** A hybrid course is one in which some face-to-face meetings **are replaced by** online learning activities.

**FO (Fully Online):** An online course is one in which instruction is conducted **entirely and exclusively online**.

**CE (Community Engaged):** A CE course includes an action/service that meets a community need in the context of partnership and reciprocity. A range of 15-30 service hours is suggested, although some CE courses will have less than 15 hours. Most of the action/service will take place outside of class time.

**No code:** If no Format Code is indicated, the course is fully face-to-face and meets in a traditional classroom on a designated day and time.

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## GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

**CORE 103 AND CORE 104.** All first-year students must register for CORE 103, Fall Community Enrichment Series, in the fall semester and for CORE 104: Spring Community Enrichment Series in the spring semester. If you failed either 103 or 104 during your first year, you must register for that course again.

Under certain extraordinary circumstances (i.e. semester-long study abroad, unusual family situations, etc.) students may request permission to complete CORE 103 and/or CORE 104 by portfolio. Please contact the Director of General Education before the end of the third week of the semester regarding specific requirements and permission. (Exceptions to the deadline may be made for certain emergency situations such as extended illness or injury.)

**WRIT 102** (formerly ENGL 103) is a required course for ALL Saint Francis students. Any student who has not yet taken either WRIT 103 or ENGL 103 should register for WRIT 102.

**CORE 212.** All students who entered Saint Francis between Fall 2012 and Fall 2018 must enroll in the courses comprising the Wellness component of the General Education program. For students who entered Saint Francis in Fall 2014 or after, this means that they must enroll in CORE 211 (Fall) and CORE 212 (Spring) in their second year. Students who transferred in 48 or more credits (excluding AP, CLEP, or College in High School credits) are exempt from this requirement. Students who entered the University during or after Fall 2018 do not need to register for either of these courses as they will no longer be offered.

**CORE 407.** Students who first matriculated at Saint Francis as of the Fall 2011 semester or thereafter and who are following the revised General Education program are required to take CORE 407, Keystone Seminar (3 credits), in order to fulfill the requirements of the program. It

is expected that most students will take this course in their senior year. However, this may not be possible for students in some majors.

**RELIGIOUS STUDIES.** Day school students requiring RLST 105 may not substitute a RLST 205 course taken online for RLST 105.

**PHILOSOPHY.** Students must have attained sophomore status (earned at least 28 credits) to take Philosophy courses.

Sophomores should register for PHIL 205 according to the following schedule:

- a. Last names beginning A to L: register for PHIL 205 in the Fall 2019 semester.
- b. Last names beginning M to Z: register for PHIL 205 in the Spring 2020 semester.

**WRITING COMPETENCY EXAM** Students in the Junior cohort who have completed at least 60 credits, but no more than 95, who have not yet passed this exam **will be automatically enrolled\* in the exam** after the grades for the Spring 2019 WCE have been submitted. (\*Students who have earned a C or better in WRIT 199, *Argumentative Writing*, will be exempt from taking the WCE. Students enrolled in WRIT 199 for the Fall 2019 semester will not be enrolled in the WCE.) Students will not be allowed to drop the exam except under extraordinary conditions, and with the approval of their advisor and the of Dean of General Education. Early in the semester students will have the opportunity to sign up for one of several dates during which the exam will be offered. Students who are enrolled in the exam during the Fall but fail to take it, will receive an “F” on their transcripts.

**Seniors** (i.e., students who have earned 96 or more credits) **will not be allowed to enroll in EXAM 301. Instead, all Seniors who have not yet passed the WCE (or ENGL 199 with a grade of C or better) will be enrolled in CORE 199, unless they opt to register for a 3-credit argumentative writing course (WRIT 199). Passing this course with at least a C will exempt students from taking and having to pass the WCE.**

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### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

**PROSPECTIVE GRADUATES.** If you think you will be eligible to graduate in December 2019, you must file an Application for Degree form at the Registrar's Office not later than the last day of Spring semester 2019. This will initiate a final evaluation of your academic records as a check for fulfillment of graduation requirements.

**PREREQUISITES.** You are responsible for knowing and meeting all prerequisites for the courses which you select.

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## INDEPENDENT STUDY

Students who intend to enroll in Independent Study 501 should obtain a copy of the Guide for Independent Study, which is available in the Academic Forms section of the student menu on the Local Web, and on My.Francis. Students should discuss their proposal for Independent Study with a faculty member selected to serve as faculty sponsor for the project.

Academic year 2019-20 begins on the first day of classes for Fall Semester 2019 and ends on the last day of Summer Session 2020..

INTERNSHIPS - PROCEDURE TO REGISTER:

To earn credits for an internship, you must register for two corequisite courses (e.g., ACCT 398 and ACCT 399). In a particular discipline, the course numbered 398 is the project portion of that internship and will be graded A-F. The corequisite course in that same discipline numbered 399 is the supervised experience portion of the internship and will be graded Pass-Fail.

Both courses, 398 and 399, are variable-credit courses which means that the number of credits to be earned in each course depends on the total number of internship credits you intend to earn. The minimum number of credits for an internship is two (2) credits; the maximum number is fifteen (15) credits, unless otherwise noted. The chart below will be followed to determine the number of credits for each of the co-requisite courses. **Students will not be allowed to register for internships until their internship contracts are signed by the Provost.**

The number of credits that can be counted toward the major may vary by department, but no more than nine hours of internship credit may count toward any major.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE OF THE CHART: Select the number in column A which corresponds to the TOTAL NUMBER OF CREDITS you intend to earn for the internship. Opposite that number in column B is the number of credits to be earned in 398; in column C is the number of credits to be earned in 399.

For example, if you intend to earn 10 credits for an internship, you must register for three (2) credits in 398 and eight (8) credits in 399.
